## Chapter 15

"What's Sext?"

So, now we have come full circle. Remember the purpose of this period is twofold, primarily for the Jews coming to faith and accepting that Jesus is the Messiah, and secondarily for the judgment of the Gentile world. During that time, all hell will break loose, literally. Only Jesus has the power to make things right, however, it's going to get worse before it gets better. Nonetheless, Christ will win in the end. Below is an overview of the Book of Revelation with important key verses. Let's take a moment to clarify an incorrect understanding of the term "Apocalypse." Nearly everyone, both the churched and unchurched, have heard the terms Armageddon, Rapture, Tribulation, and Apocalypse. However, many of both groups are uneducated on the correct meaning of those terms. Trust me they have nothing to do with vampires, zombies, or walking dead. Apocalypse is incorrectly identified as a horrible final event or war or a harbinger of doom. The correct definition of Apocalypse is a Greek term meaning "to reveal" or "to remove the curtain," a Revelation. Through John, God lays out His final seven-year plan to reclaim those souls left after in the Rapture, Jew, and Gentile. Notice below chart does not give specific definitions of the length of time each calamity takes. Some may take days, some might take weeks or months. The only time of note is the half way point (7 years split in half equals 3 ½ years each) at the abomination of desolation mentioned in Daniel 9:27, Matthew 24:15, and Revelation 13:5-7 "5 And there was given unto him a mouth speaking great things and blasphemies; and power was given unto him to "continue" forty and two months (second half 3 ½ years). <sup>6</sup> And he opened his mouth in blasphemy against God, to blaspheme His name, and His tabernacle, and them that dwell in heaven. <sup>7</sup> And it was given unto him to make war with the saints, and to overcome them: and power was given him over all kindreds, and tongues, and nations."

The first half is called the Tribulation and the second half is called the Great Tribulation. The Book of Revelation breakes down the first half of the Tribulation in chapters 6-11, where we see the arrival of the Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse (also the first 4 seals), followed by the remaining 3 of the 7 seals, after which point we have the sealing of the 144,000, the seven trumpets, and closing out the first half, the introduction of the two witnesses. Chapter 12 details the midpoint with the woman giving birth and the Dragon lying in wait to devour the child. The Great Tribulation begins the second half in chapter 13, detailing the Beasts of the Sea and of the Earth, the 144,000 once again, and ending with the final seven bowls including the gathering of Satan's forces at Armageddon in chapter 16. In chapters 17 through the 1st half of 19, speaks about the Scarlet Woman, mystery Babylon, the Final Battle, Christ's arrival as Messiah where He completes His final victory, and lastly, the Beast and the False Prophet being thrown into the lake of fire. The 2nd half of chapter 19 through chapter 22, we are given details about Satan being bound and cast into the lake of fire while we rule with Christ on earth for 1,000 years, aka the Millennium. It then closes out with God recasting the earth and heaven into a new earth and new heaven where we will live for eternity.
